

## **“The King of Deliverance”** **Isaiah 33**

### **Appeal to God V. 1-6**

“Ah” V. 1 – This woe represents Assyria specifically as they took bribe money to leave Judah alone then attacked anyway, and in general all nations that are duplicitous.

**2 Kings 18:13-16**

Appeal V. 2 – In this appeal Isaiah voices the repentance and desired heart of the people by God. **Psalm 9**

God’s Character V. 3-6 – God’s authority and sovereignty over the physical things (armies, governments and gold). His real treasure is in His eternal Character; justice, righteousness, stability, salvation, wisdom, knowledge, and awe. **Ezra 1**

### **Deliverance V. 7-16**

Hopelessness V.7-9 – Judah’s warriors and diplomats have all failed and are weeping with hopelessness. Assyria (the world) has no regard for the character of God or His people. There is no human hope left even in the most stable of resources.

**Jeremiah 29:10-14**

Promised Action V. 10-16 – At the end of human hopelessness “now” God arises and provides hope in the utter destruction of the enemies of God. He does this in a way which can only be God so that He will be glorified and gather all the faithful to him. **Psalm 24**

### **The King and His City V. 17-24**

Then, Now and Later – God’s promise of deliverance is threefold; in Hezekiah’s day, with Christ’s deliverance from sin, and in the second coming. **Revelation 21:1-4**

The Kings Provision – His provision can only be God not any earthly king. His provision is exemplified in three ways.

- The Tent – The human insecurity of a tent will be God’s security stronger and more permanent than any human fortress. **Exodus 40:34-38**
- The Stream – Sure waters of peace and abundance absent of warships and drought. **Psalm 46**
- The Final Promise – God will be the judge, the lawgiver, the healer of all hurts and the forgiver of all iniquity. **Ephesians 1:3-10**
