### COST:

The cost of camp is \$295, which includes a \$100 nonrefundable deposit required at the time of registration. Deposits can be made at [valleybaptist.org/events](http://valleybaptist.org/events), at the Information Center on either campus on Sunday, or in the Student Office during the week at the Fruitvale Campus. All money and forms are due by June 30th. All money is handled through Valley Baptist Church and not the camp.

### SIBLING DISCOUNT & SCHOLARSHIPS:

If you have more than one student attending Summer Camp, you will pay the total price for the first student and pay \$150 for the second (or additional) siblings. This includes Kids Camp and Middle School and High School Camp.

Scholarships are available! A form must be completed, and the student must write a paragraph explaining why they would like to go to camp.

Hartland offers scholarships for students who are in foster care or who have a parent who is incarcerated.

### FORMS:

Parents, once you register your student(s) with us, you will receive an email from Hartland Camp with a link and code to complete your student's registration. There are 2 paper forms to complete – a Valley Baptist Medical form and a Hartland Camp Liability form (unless your student went to Winter Camp) – which are to be turned in at the Parent Meeting on June 30th. ### WHAT NOT TO BRING:

- Alcohol
- Firearms
- Pocket knives
- Drugs (unless prescribed by a doctor)
- Fireworks
- Cell phone\*
- Vape pens

\*Church staff will collect cell phones at the campground entrance, place them in a Ziploc bag, and store them in a locked office. We will return cell phones as we leave at the end of camp. You can call the Hartland Camp if you need to contact your student at (559) 337-2349.

### PARENT MEETING:

Camp meeting for parents and students will be on **Sunday, June 30th**, at the Olive Drive Campus Worship Center at 3:00 PM. All money and forms are due at this time. Accommodations can be made for families who are unable to attend. Please notify Student Ministry Staff beforehand.

### HEALTH SCREEN:

Health screening is on **Saturday, July 13th**. Come between 2-4 PM to the Great Room on the Olive Drive Campus. The health screening will include a lice check and a quick questionnaire. We will also finalize any last-minute details. Please mark your calendar and attend. Attending helps expedite the check-in on Sunday afternoon.

### SPECIAL DIETARY NEEDS:

You will be asked in the online registration for Hartland; be sure to list needs. The camp recognizes the needs associated with special diets as well as those presented by personal food choices. If your student has special dietary needs, contact Joy to get menu information. They do their best to provide options.

### MEDICATION:

All students must turn in medication at check-in on the day of departure. Please do not send general medicines (Advil, Tylenol, etc.). A medicine form must be submitted for each medication.

- **Students bringing medication (prescription or non-prescription), must be in a Ziploc bag with the original medication container (no loose pills). Send enough medication for the week, plus 2 extra days.**
- **Students are not allowed to have medication with them (even Advil, etc). Inhalers and EpiPens are the exceptions to the rule, BUT you still must inform us that your student(s) will carry it with them.**



## **DRESS CODE:**

This is set by Hartland Christian Camp: We have the unique opportunity to create a setting that fosters spiritual, relational, and personal growth. Your dress can help or hinder that goal, so please be modest. Here are some guidelines to help you keep everyone's best interests in mind: Modest shorts & tank tops/t-shirts (shorts MUST allow fingertips to touch fabric when arms are extended to the front and back, tank tops cannot be open-back, excessive armpit cutout, exposed torso and/or undergarments are NOT allowed), swimsuit (girls must wear a dark-colored t-shirt over a swimsuit), no spaghetti straps, halter tops, bare midriffs, tight or short shorts (girls), sagging shorts (guys), etc. Do not wear pants or shorts with lettering on the bottom.

## **SPENDING MONEY:**

Students will want money for snacks, Hartland merchandise, and games: paintball (\$10 for 100 balls, \$5 for the next 100), ping-pong balls (\$0.50), foosball (\$0.50)

Have a conversation with your student to keep all valuables at home. Also, talk to them about taking precautions with money to prevent loss.
